





Threats are no longer contained by borders





THE STATE OF THE WORLD'S MIDWIFERY 2020 REPORT



The year 2020 will mark the 200th anniversary of the birth of Florence Nightingale and two flagship reports

What

The State of the World's Nursing report and the State of the World's Midwifery 2020 report

The WHO State of the World's Aursing report will describe how the nursing workbroe will help deliver Universal Health Coverage (LHC) and the Sustainable Development for soal (SDSs), and highlight or eas for policy development for the next three to the years. It will also provide a technical description of the nursing workbroe in Member Stales, including the number and types of nurses, education, regulation, practice, leadership, and gender issues. The State of the World's Michaelps 2020 will report on the progress and future challenges to deliver effective coverage and quality michaelps yeardoes. This will be the third State of the World's Michaelps (1991) and 2015.

Why

prive investment in nursing and midwifery workforces to help achieve UHC and the SDGs

The reports will inform retional policy dislogue on strengthening intring and midwilery and accelerating progress across the SDGs. The evidence base on the role of nurses and midwitwes can beig drive the development of national workforces and unlock line sment in nurshing midwifery, and the gender equity agendas for generations.

How

National Health Workforce Accounts, Government Chief Nursing and Midwifery Officers, and Partners

Both the reports will primarily use the listional Health Workbroze Accounts (HHWA) as the main source of data. NHWA are countryled systems that aim at improving availability, quality, analysis and use of health workbroze data for policy development. NHWA maximizes the use of routine and ad-hoc country level data collection via a national local point mechanism who is responsible for validating and reporting health workforce data. In many countries, NHWA data collection efforts can be enhanced by contributions from regulatory counts, education institutions, professional associations, employers, population-based surveys and others. Global Chief Nursing and Midwillery Others (GCNMOs) and pertners (associations, unions, councils, educators) are encouraged to coordinate with NHWA focal points to other the data validation and reporting efforts, using processes established for NHWA reporting.

Wher

Data collection, validation, and policy dialogue in 2019 for launch in May 2020

All data must be collated and validated by the mid-point of 2019. The second half of 2019 will be dedicated to data analysis and report writing to be ready for a launch during the 772" World Health Assembly.

With whom

WHO Member States, Nursing and Midwifery Leaders, and Stakeholders

WHO's State of the World's Nursing report will be developed in close collaboration with the International Council of Nurses (CN) and the Kursingkion campaign. The State of the World' Mowley 2020 report will be a joint endeavor of United Nations Population Fund (UNEPA), the International Confederation of Michiwies (ICM) and the World Health Organization (WHO).

To present the most robust evidence base for the State of the Woods's Nursing and the State of the Words's Midwifery 2020 reports, broad engagement of nursing and midwifery leaders stableholders is needed, Gwemment officials have an important role in leading the data collection, validation, and potcy dialogue processes, with the support of WHO and UNEPA, and engaging relevant stakeholders.
